Metric units are divided into ten subunits, which can be further divided. This means that very accurate measurements can be made, such as measuring the width of a human hair (about 0.004mm). It is easy to convert from one unit to another – for example, knowing that 1mm is approximately the width of a Post-it note will make it easier to work out how long 10m would be. The metric system has been adopted by more than 170 countries across the world. The units that are used in the metric system are also used in other ways, for example Kelvin for temperature measurement and Celsius, which is the scale generally used for everyday temperatures. There are different units of measurement that can be used to measure length. These include: centimetres (cm), millimetres (mm) and metres (m). The prefix 'cent' means one hundredth, 1cm = 100mm. The prefix 'milli' means one thousandth, so 1mm = 1000µm. The metre is based on scientific principles to make it easy to use. It is a very large unit, to make it easier to add and divide up. The metre is 1 yard long, or approximately 39.37" (0.9144m) or 3.28ft (1yd). In August 2014 the metric system was adopted for road signs in Denmark and soon after, in September 2014 it started a transition plan for a transition from imperial to metric units on all other public signs that was completed by mid 2015. The metric for land area is square metres. This is the same as the English square yard, but in non-metric countries, yards are still in use. The metric system was officially adopted in Norway on 1 May 2018. The changeover will take place over a five-year period to coincide with changes in road signs. The metric system was adopted by Ireland on 30 September 2017, with the conversion of road traffic signs being completed earlier in 2018. On 1 May 2018 all public signs changed to use imperial units for height and width instead of feet or inches. The Imperial conversion rate was 0.5% which were all converted by 31 March 2018 via an online page setting up to convert imperial units to metric units.
